In This Issue

In this month's newsletter, we have information regarding the switch to the summer water system, discussion about upcoming project plans, and dates for the upcoming board meetings and the annual membership meeting.

WATER SYSTEM UPDATE

April 1st marks the start of the allowable irrigation season for those properties with separate irrigation rights. At this time, all lots within Crumbacher Estates may water outdoors as necessary. Our water operator will be monitoring system pressure and will switch over to the summer pump system as demand increases.

Please delay outdoor watering or conserve as much as possible to help keep our electrical bill as low as possible. Our summer pump uses significantly more power to operate than the winter system, with summer electric bills often ten times as high as winter. Every day we can delay turning on the summer pump is a cost savings for all of us!

Carl Behrent, our certified operator since 2010, recently informed the Board that he will be leaving the area and will no longer be able to serve our system after April 30th. The Board is currently reviewing the list of state certified operators and making calls to see if there are any interested candidates.

We have greatly appreciated Carl's efforts through the years to keep our system running despite worn out equipment, power outages, line breaks, and minimal funding for upgrades. Carl has helped our water system stay in compliance with water testing and we have had minimal problems noted during routine inspections. On behalf of everyone in the association, we are very grateful for all the hard work Carl has given through the past twelve years!

WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS

The Board will be hiring a contractor to complete another phase of improvements to the water system this summer. We are looking to replace the main meter at the pump house so that we can track our total water production. The current meter has not been

functioning for several years and Department of Health requires an annual submittal of this reading.

Additionally, we hope to replace the rest of the main line valves in the water system. This would allow sections to be isolated while the rest of the system retains water pressure. With this improvement, we would be able to keep water flowing to most customers when we resume meter installations, rather than shutting down the entire system.
